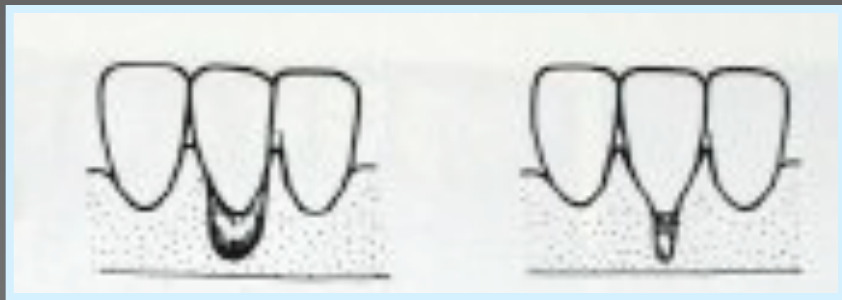

Classification of Recession- Miller

■ Class 1

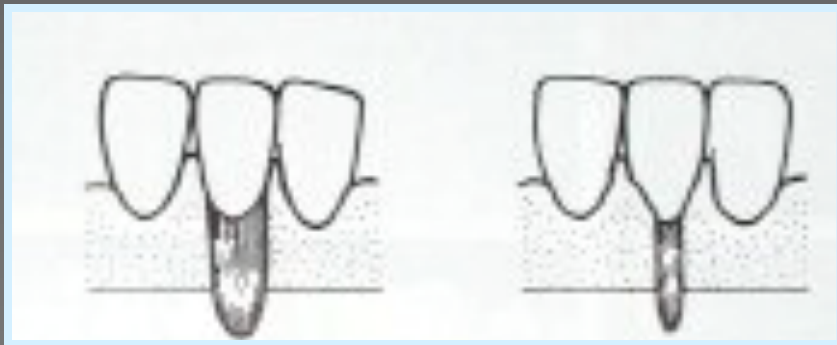
- Coronal to the mucogingival junction
- No interproximal soft tissue or bone loss



Classification of Recession- Miller

■ Class 2

- Extends to or beyond the mucogingival junction
- No interproximal soft tissue or bone loss



Classification of Recession- Miller

■ Class 3

- Extends to or beyond the mucogingival junction
- Interdental soft tissue or bone loss
- Or malpositioning of teeth



Classification of Recession- Miller

■ Class 4

- Extends to or beyond the mucogingival junction
- Severe bone or soft tissue loss in the interdental area
- Or severe malposition
