

Patients With Insurance

It is advisable that you know your own dental coverage terms and limitations. Many variables exist from carrier to carrier (i.e. *deductibles, annual maximums, allowable fee limitations, non-covered procedures and other restrictions*). For this reason we cannot guarantee that your insurance will pay for any submitted charges, ultimately you are responsible for all charges. Your insurance coverage is an agreement between you and the insurance company.

As a courtesy, we are happy to file the forms necessary to assist you in receiving the full benefit of your dental insurance.

It is at the recommendation of various insurance carriers that a pre-treatment estimate for costs over \$300 be submitted prior to work being started. This allows you a more accurate determination as to the out of pocket cost to you. Again, this is a recommendation NOT a requirement to authorize dental work.

YES, please file a pre-treatment estimate claim for procedures over \$300.

NO, it is not necessary to file a pre-treatment estimate claim for procedures over \$300.
